Meet TIA's New Japanese System Coordinator, Ms. Tokunaga!



The Japanese Language Learning Support System for Toyota City has a new program coordinator. We delightedly take this opportunity to get our foreign community acquainted with her. Effective April 1, 2020, Ms. Miho Tokunaga, has assumed leadership of the program, which she had been with for some time as a volunteer up until March of this year, when the program was being run by Nagoya University.

As of April 1, 2020, the beginning of this fiscal year, TIA has taken over the reins, and Ms Tokunaga is now on board as a member of the TIA staff. She hails from Nagoya City and is passionately sharing her knowledge and experience with the foreign residents of Toyota City through the program. She is working full-time, in her own words, "to contribute to the building of a platform where Japanese and foreigners living or working in Toyota City can find a common fundamental ground for understanding to take root through Japanese language communication." She stresses that the objective of the program is to provide foreign nationals with the basic opportunity to acquire the Japanese Language, as well as to equip the volunteers with the know how to effectively communicate with their foreign friends and neighbors using Japanese as a tool.

It all started when Toyota City recognized a vast communication gap existing between the citizens and the incoming residents from overseas and, in an endeavor to bridge it, employed the expertise of Nagoya University. The city started the pendulum's swing in 2007 and the program has since undergone a number of improvements; nonetheless, the acquisition of the Japanese language by foreign residents, in order to create an ease in their collective living experience in Japan remains the unanimous focus.

Having benefited from the program myself, after my arrival in Japan, I strongly recommend it to anyone seeking to start their journey into learning and embracing the culture. TIA also provides information on some of the other Japanese language programs throughout the city in a handbook that newcomers to these surroundings might find quite convenient. The guidebook is printed in multiple languages, including Japanese, Portuguese, Chinese, Indonesian, Mongolian, Napali, Korean, Thai and Vietnamese, and is easy to use. Users can choose based on the contents each institution offers, the schedule, and the geographical location. If you wish, you can swing by the office at TIA to get a copy for yourself. Tour Toyota City's Natural Asset, the Yanami Wetland!



Nature lovers, for a limited time only, Toyota City opens up the Yanami Wetland for public observation. Each year, for a period of about one week, we are given the rare opportunity to visit this wetland, whose designation comes from the Ramsar Convention. We are delighted to announce that we will again be offering a tour to foreign residents and visitors to Toyota City. TIA, in collaboration with Toyota City, in the effort to boost hospitality in the city towards our foreign residents and guests, has repeatedly chosen this spot, in west-rural Toyota City, to be introduced as one of the city's many natural assets. The wetland is home to plants and wildlife that are indigenous only to this geographical region, where some 300 types of plants and about 500 types of wildlife can be observed in their natural habitat.

Board a hydrogen fuel-cell bus, one of Toyota Motor Corporation's newest installments to its enormous fleet of eco-friendly vehicles, for an adventure into the lush hills of the Yanami area. Come and observe this rich and abundant nature that Toyota City has been nurturing to its optimum potential for many years.

Regarding the Use of TIA, & Important Information in Relation to the COVID-19 (Coronavirus) Pandemic
